What is the activity?

The primary mission of SHELDON Foundation is to provide the intel_{lert} memergency alert service to non-profit organizations engaged in serving the public. $intel_{lert}$ is an intelligent, comprehensive, easy-to-use, telephonic alert system that was originally developed for the Civil Air Patrol as a means to rapidly alert members to search and rescue missions. With a single, toll-free call to $intel_{lert}$ a Group Leader (or a Designee thereof) can broadcast a customized alert message to dozens of Group Members in just minutes.

Who conducts the activity?

 $intel_{|ert^{TM}}$ is operated by SHELDON Foundation directors, officers, and employees.

When is the activity conducted?

 $inte/_{lert}$ is an automated system that operates 24/7 on a specialized server.

Where is the activity conducted?

intel_{|ert}™ is operated out of the corporation's office in Harvest, AL. The service is available to all qualified organizations nationwide.

How does the activity further your exempt purpose?

intel_{|ert}™ supports organizations engaged in serving the public, such as the Civil Air Patrol, schools, fire departments, and others, by pro-

viding an economical and efficient means to rapidly alert members of their respective organizations during emergency situations.

What percentage of your total time is allocated to the activity?

Because $intel_{|ert|^{TM}}$ is provided on a continuous basis (24/7) and because $intel_{|ert|^{TM}}$ is the only service provided by the Foundation, 100% of SHELDON Foundation's time is allocated to this activity.

How is the activity funded?

intel_{|ert}™ operating costs are recovered primarily through the collection of monthly user fees. The following fee structure for the intel_{|ert}™ emergency alert service was adopted by the Board of Directors of SHELDON Foundation and is current as of March 19, 2005:

\$0.75 per active Group Member per month

Use of the service is unlimited – there are no per-call or per-minute fees. An invoice is delivered via email to each Group Leader on the $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ of each month.

In addition to user fees, the Foundation also accepts donations from directors, officers, employees, and outside sources.
